Rear Admiral Paul Edward Tobin, Jr. (pictured above) will present the **Third Annual Mary Tanner Lecture**. It will be given on **Saturday, October 7**th **at 2 pm** in Behr Hall on the campus of The Lawrenceville School from which Rear Admiral Tobin graduated in 1958. The lecture is entitled "Victory from Defeat" and its subject is Captain James Lawrence, name sake of our township and the originator of the official U. S Navy slogan, "Don't Give up the Ship!" The lecture is free and a reception will follow.

Rear Admiral Tobin's personal Awards include two Distinguished Service Medal's, four Legions of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Meritorious Service Medal, and three Navy Commendation Medals.

The first two speakers from the series were James McPherson and Tom Kindre.

Mary Tanner Lecturer Biography...

Rear Admiral Paul Edward Tobin, Jr., graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1963. Among his variety of Naval assignments, Rear Admiral Tobin commanded the USS TATTNALL (DDG 19) and the USS FOX (CG 33). The Rear Admiral Paul Edward Tobin, Jr. held many positions throughout his distinguished thirty-five year career in the Navy. His final assignment was as Oceanographer of the Navy.

After retiring from active duty in 1998, Rear Admiral Tobin became the Executive Director of AFCEA in Fairfax, Virginia. In 2005, Rear Admiral Tobin assumed duties as the 11th Director of Naval History. He is married to Lynne Carter Tobin from Shaker Heights, Ohio, and they have two daughters, Mary Elizabeth and Patricia.

Special guests at the lecture will be members of the Burlington County Historical Society, which boasts the birthplace of Captain Lawrence. Society Executive Director Lisa Fox and Education Director Jeffrey Macechak will personally invite us to their all-day Lawrence celebration on October 29th.

Funds for LHS Administrator Sought...

This past winter, The Society Board of Directors submitted a grant request of \$10,000 to the New Jersey Historical Commission to help offset the cost of retaining a part-time administrator. Earlier this summer, citing "yeoman and successful efforts to restore two sites..." (The Brearley House and the Port Mercer Canal House), the review panel identified several challenges which face the LHS before funding can be secured. The panel noted a reduction in membership and programs and the absence of an organized fund raiser or annual appeal. Although the LHS has excellent and long standing corporate sponsors—namely ETS and PNC Bank, the panel felt more corporate contributions could be secured. They also pointed out that the proposed responsibilities of the administrator far exceeded the 9 hours per week that were budgeted.
